


As a result of the mid-year review of our response plans, UNICEF has revised its programme targets and funding needs for the second half of 2014. Below is a summary of results to date (January – June) against these revised targets as well as the updated funding requirements. UNICEF current funding gap for response plans inside Syria and in neighbouring countries is US\$462.5m. Urgent support is required to bridge this gap so that UNICEF can continue to provide life-saving assistance to the children of Syria.



## Water


In Syria, UNICEF is supplying water treatment chemicals that treat enough water to serve over 16.55 million people.

In neighboring countries, 493,629 people provided with access to drinking and domestic water.



## Child Protection

435,043 children with access to psychosocial support services.



### **Education**


In Syria, UNICEF learning materials for 2 million children have been procured and will be distributed in time for the 2014/2015 school year.

In neighbouring countries, 313,212 refugee children reached.





25,795,186 children vaccinated against polio in 2014




18 campaigns are scheduled between July and December 2014.


**Funding Status per Country**
